And the only thing missing was you.



Darcie was one of us, she felt our pain, she walked our walk, she was a bereaved parent. She is once again holding her precious son, Austin.





One Day At A Time

Today marks 6 years, 24 days since the loss of our 18 year old daughter, Kristin. Tomorrow we would have celebrated her 25th birthday. A year ago, her cousin Erin was married. Kristin was missing. Last October, our son Eric married Lauren. Kristin should have been there. In June, one of Kristin's best friends, Courtney, will marry Phillip on the beach in Cancun. All of Courtney's closest friends will be in the wedding...there will be an empty space for Kristin...

Over the past six years, I have learned to "handle" my grief. I can reach out to others who unwillingly find themselves in this dark *club*, assuring them that they will survive, just as so many of us have done before them. I try to say the *right* things to give others hope, but then I feel like a hypocrite when I am bawling my eyes out at any given moment, like during the occasions above.

Thankfully, the tears are so much more infrequent than 5 or 6 years ago. I passed the "I want to die" stage, then spent some time in the "I want to disappear" stage... disappear in the bottle... disappear into the world of the homeless... disappear to a mountain cabin and live as a hermit... However, time passes and I believe there's a chance that maybe I can do this, try to live my life as "normal" as possible.

So my life has moved forward, but I'd never call it *normal*. I do my best to say and do the *right* things. I'm as *okay* as I can be under the circumstances... until October... Halloween and the adorable children running around excitedly in their costumes... no laughter from Kristin. November, and Thanksgiving with families gathering to give thanks... but there's an empty chair in our home. Christmas brings memories of our happiest times spent as a family... We've made new memories, but they will never be the same without Kristin... January brings with it the beginning of a new year... another year that Kristin will never see... February brings another "angel date" and another year without our family complete... March is the birthday month in our home. All three of our children were born in March so we celebrate Eric's on the 2nd and Jessica's on the 24th, but in between we attend Mass *in memory of* Kristin on the 19th. So unfair.


It doesn't end there. Easter in April, Mother's Day in May, Father's Day in June, great memories of our annual 4th of July celebration spent with my husband Tom's extended family in Florida. Tom's birthday in August, mine in September. And so it goes year after year after year...

Thankfully, all of the above mentioned occasions are a day here, a day there. They amount to 12 days out of the year so there are another 353 days we can count as *ordinary* days. Our children remain in our hearts on even the most ordinary of days, but it's *different* than the other 12.

It's easy for me to sit here and talk the talk, but it isn't always easy to walk the walk. Today I find myself *walking the walk*, but tomorrow is another day. It will be Kristin's 25th birthday, but she will be Forever 18 in our hearts. I'll somehow manage to get through yet another day without my "Poopsie," another birthday she must celebrate with her *angel friends*. The following day, I'll wake up to another ordinary day where Kristin will enter my thoughts but it won't be nearly as painful. I still have a few of those *other* days ahead of me this year, but I've learned to take it "one day at a time."

I wish you well as you take your own personal journeys. May you find many more days filled with peace rather than pain. We **can** do this...
